

Synthesis of the week in the field of integrity promotion: the NAC officers, together with the team of volunteers, continued anti-corruption trainings within the Ministry of Internal Affairs, in some health centres and schools in the country



The campaigns "Integrity for a Safe Society" and "Integrity for Health", carried out by the National Anti-corruption Centre, continue to promote ethical standards and corruption prevention in public institutions in the Republic of Moldova. Within the framework of the campaign "Integrity for a Safe Society", activities were organized in nine structures of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, including within the General Inspectorate of Police (Central Regional Directorate), the General Inspectorate for Migration, the police inspectorates in Cimişlia and Ialoveni, the Material Reserves Agency, the National Single Service for Emergency Calls 112, the Central Police Station Chişinău and the General Inspectorate for Emergency Situations. The initiative aims to strengthen institutional integrity as an essential element of good governance, by promoting a climate based on ethics, responsibility and transparency within the structures of the Ministry of Internal Affairs.

At the same time, as part of the "Integrity for Health" campaign, the NAC officers, in collaboration with anti-corruption volunteers, held information sessions for medical personnel from health centers in Ialoveni and Cimişlia. The discussions focused on the importance of respecting integrity norms and preventing corrupt practices in the exercise of professional duties.

Promoting an organizational culture based on integrity was also addressed in a training dedicated to employees of the Chişinău Probation Office, where ethical standards and principles of good governance were presented, through practical examples and interactive dialogue.

Information and awareness-raising activities were also organized in educational institutions, including the "Gheorghe Asachi" Theoretical High School and IPLT

Măgdăcești, aimed at developing a culture of integrity among teachers and students.

In total, 14 trainings were conducted, attended by 635 people. The NAC emphasizes that promoting integrity remains a strategic priority, being essential for strengthening public trust and ensuring an efficient and accountable public service.
